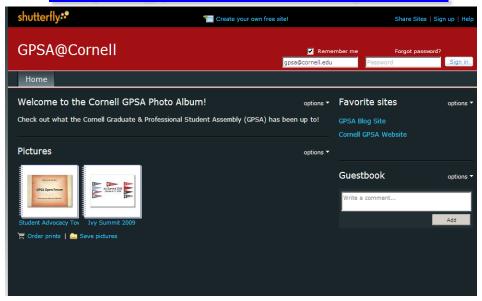

R.2 Regarding the Reduction in Maximum Individual Funding for Cornell Students with Children and the Graduate Student Response

Whereas the Fiscal-Year 2009-2010 Cornell University Graduate and Professional Student Childcare Grant maximum available individual funding is set tentatively at \$1500 with the last two funding cycles set at \$5000;

Whereas the reduction in funding is not due to a direct cut, but rather the transfer of the Grant's administration from the Office of Human Resources to the Graduate School and the Provost's Office reinstated the existing, but not enforced, maximum individual funding of \$1500;

Whereas the Childcare Grant is a unique assistantship program for Graduate and Professional Students with Children among our Peer Ivy League Institutions;

Whereas the Graduate and Professional Student Community (hereafter referred to as the GPSC) composed and circulated a letter entitled "Reduction in Child Care Grant 09/10 for Students with Children" addressed to the Cornell University's President Skorton, outlining and addressing the benefits of the initial Childcare Grant Program and the impacts of the Grant's alteration;

Whereas the Graduate and Professional Student Assembly (hereafter referred to as the GPSA) serves as an official advocacy link between the Graduate and Professional Student Community and Cornell University's Administration as empowered in Article 2.01 of the GPSA Charter;

Be it therefore resolved that the GPSA submit with this resolution and publish on the GPSA website the letter "Reduction in Child Care Grant 09/10 for Students with Children" supporting the findings as it accurately reflects and is derived directly from the constituents that are affected, fulfilling the requirements of Article 2.01.b of the GPSA Charter;

Be it further resolved that the efforts of Cornell University's Administration to provide balanced and constructive assistance to the GPSC with Children be formally recognized;

Be it further resolved that GPSA Student Advocacy Committee be tasked with maintaining communication between Cornell University's Administration and the GPSC with Children fulfilling the requirements of Article 6.04.g of the GPSA Charter.

Be it finally resolved that this resolution be sent to David Skorton, President of Cornell University; Kent Fuchs, Cornell University Provost; Kent Hubbell, Dean of Students; Alison Power, Dean of the Graduate School; and Brenda Marston, Cornell Childcare Services Subcommittee Chair.

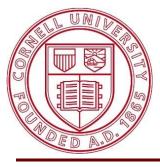

Activity Fee Voting Procedure (per group)



YES

You agree with the recommendation (we do not consider the TOTAL activity fee sum at this time)

- (a) You do not agree with the recommendation but feel group should receive byline funding
- (b) You do not agree that group should receive byline funding

Requires Simple Majority to pass.

If majority vote is NO, Appropriations comes up with a new Recommendation Next meeting, re-vote occurs. If NO again, group loses byline funding for 2010-2012. Any group losing byline funding is eligible again for 2012-2014

Activity Fee Voting Procedure (continued)

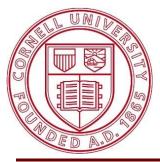
Considering all the byline groups that received the majority of YES votes, we now consider the Activity Fee as a whole.

You can then request "amendments" to the funding a particular group receives.

Requires Simple Majority. Charter Rules previously stated still apply

Activity Fee must pass with <u>2/3 vote from SEATED VOTING MEMBERS</u>.

If we fail to pass an Activity Fee by the end of the semester, the activity fee will revert back to the 2008-2010 activity fee (currently @ \$70.00)



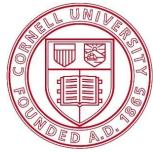
Orientation

- A significant graduate population engages in international and cultural events
 about 33% of the graduate and professional students are international
- Through active co-sponsorships, it attempts to target and include the crosssections of the international community at Cornell
- Efforts made to advertise and target a wider audience in graduate population
- Status quo funding or cuts in funding would result in fewer activities and events
- \$0.05 decrease due to faculty turnover

 - CCC group agrees that no transfers will occur in future
- Statistics provided from concert pre-sales show that graduate students are taking advantage of concerts on campus
 - Grad attendance varies by show: 2% 27%

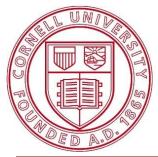

 - Past Events: Bill Maher, Howie Mandel; Gov. George Pataki; BJ Novak; Stephen Colbert
- Howie Mandel took a huge loss → due to economic downturn and drop in number of parents coming to Parent's Week
 - CUPB tried to increase demand (i.e. TV time in Syracuse)
- Reorganized event scheduling and locations to attract larger audiences with lower costs.
 - Collaborating with State Theater to host events.
 - Utilizing Bailey Hall over Statler Hall & Barton Hall to cut costs

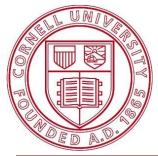

- Primary reason for increase due to \$16k in funding cuts made by other sources (i.e. NY state grants)
- Grads make up about 25% of total tickets sales according to informal audience polling
- Has reduced # of titles to reduce expenses
- Same amount of fund increase for GPSA and SA
- Survey sent out and responses from grad students
- Appropriation Committee recommends a better method to assess graduate participation in cinema

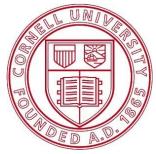

- Primary request is to bring parity with undergraduates (note: proposed undergraduate \$10 fee is composed of \$7.00 for Big Red Sports Pass and \$3.00 for undergraduate-specific marketing)
- Athletics has not requested an increase since 2001
- Athletics agrees not to request more in next funding cycle AND not to raise men's ice hockey ticket price for graduate and professional students during this funding cycle.
- Athletics is willing to work with graduate and professional students: increased men's ice hockey season tickets from 200 to 250; first option for unsold undergraduate tickets for men's ice hockey season tickets; extend student price for men's ice hockey to spouses
- Athletics will put guarantees in writing

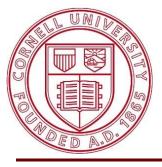

- Primary request for increase is based on withdrawal of university funding to event and desire to maintain fiscal balance.
- Increase from previous cycle was composed in April 2009 before utilization statistics from Slope Day 2009 were available
- Slope Day 2009 statistics show (based on card swipes at various gates):
 - 1,789 graduate scans (1,592 unique scans; 197 re-entered)
 - 11,139 undergraduate scans (8,831 unique scans; 2,308 re-entered)
- Graduate and professional students = 13 % of all attendees
- SDPB suggest that \$3.24 is an equitable amount (represents ratio of graduate student usage and fee to undergraduate usage and fee)

Recommendation to Fund: \$2.82
