Propose on November 4th, 2013

Whereas, the Student Assembly is charged with the authority and the responsibility to examine any matters which involve the interests or concern the welfare of the student community, and to make proposals concerning those issues to the appropriate officers or decision-making bodies of the University; Whereas, the University has embraced the guiding principles of "Any person, any study" and "Open doors, Open hearts, Open minds," and has further worked to foster an inclusive community through Toward New Destinations; Whereas, there has been a continued trend of unfortunate bias incidents, sexual assaults, and group misconduct, coupled with an inconsistent response structure; Whereas, the University created the Group Misconduct website to document "group or team" violations of the Campus Code of Conduct, or infractions of other university or community policies"; Whereas, being a research institution, the University has the resources to both create and

encourage innovative educational programs and materials for the members of the community in order to foster an inclusive environment;

Whereas, over 6,000 members of the Cornell community have competed Respect@Cornell;

Be it therefore resolved, that the recent Cornell Athletics bias incident involving Ezra's Army be documented on the Group Misconduct website.

Be it further resolved, that all current staff members in all units of the University be required to complete Respect@Cornell by the end of the 2013-2014 academic year, and that all subsequent hires complete the program as part of the orientation process.

Be it further resolved, that all graduate teaching assistants be required to complete Respect@Cornell.
