- Whereas the SAFC is an important part of Cornell's funding structure and promotes student
   activity on campus,
- 4 Whereas, the process for registering a new group on campus and thus gaining eligibility for 5 SAFC funding is very simple,
- 7 Whereas, currently new groups are entitled to the lowest tier allocation limit of \$1500
- 9 Whereas, the SAFC received an influx of new funding requests this funding cycle,

- 13 Whereas, new groups should establish themselves before being eligible for extensive funding,
- Whereas, the SAFC received so many requests that it was unable to offer Special Projectfunding this semester,
