UA Resolution #4 Resolution to Modify Campus Code to Disclose Misconduct of **University Registered Organizations**

2 3	Whereas, pursuant to Article 3, Section 3.1 of its Charter, the University Assembly (the
4	Assembly) may propose changes to the Campus Code of Conduct (the Code) subject to the
5	University President's approval; and

7	Whereas, earlier this year, members of the Cornell University community indicated they would
8	like more information about misconduct by all University registered organizations, not
9	just Greek-letter organizations and athletic teams, and the University was creating a
10	website for sharing this information; and
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12	Whereas, the University has now created a website for sharing this information,
13	http://www.gannett.cornell.edu/groupmisconduct/index.cfm with a commitment to
14	transparent public communication about all infractions by any group, including but not
15	limited to registered student organizations, athletic teams, fraternities, sororities, and
16	University residences; and
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18	Whereas, on April 9, 2013 the Assembly passed Resolution 5 changing the language of the
19	Code to make public registered organization's incidents of misconduct while still
20 21	preserving the confidentiality of the individuals; and
21	Whereas, on May 8, 2013 President Skorton responded to Resolution 5 by indicating his support
23	for intent of the Resolution, but concerned the proposed wording could be misinterpreted
24	and therefore suggested some alternate language to clarify the Code; and
25	and therefore suggested some atternate language to clarify the code, and
26	Whereas, on November 8, 2013 the Assembly's Codes and Judicial Committee met and voted in
27	favor of the alternate language;
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29	Be it therefore resolved, the following Changes be made to the Code:
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31	Change Title Three, Article III.G.4.a and b to read as follows:
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33	a. All who are involved in the complaint, investigation, hearing, appeal, and reporting processes
34	are obliged to maintain confidentiality of the proceedings, except as otherwise specifically
35	provided in this Code. They shall protect the confidentiality of all judicial records, except those
36	records specifically referred to in Article II.B. Copies of judicial records shall not be released to
37	outside sources without written consent of the subject of such record, except as may be required
38	by law provided in subsection (b) below.

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40	b. The University will take reasonable measures to ensure the confidentiality of the proceedings
41	and records; however, the University cannot and does not guarantee that confidentiality can or
42	will always be maintained. Additionally, the University may disclose judicial records or
43	otherwise confidential information:
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45	i. when required by law; or,
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47	ii. when authorized by law and necessary to protect the safety or well-being of the
48	University community members, or to preserve the integrity of proceedings under this Code; or
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50	iii. with respect to the judicial records of University registered organizations only, when
51	deemed necessary to educate the University community or to provide information to the
52	University community about the organization's conduct.
